Preliminary Requirements/Audition Process

Resumes and audio recordings must be received by **April 1**st, **2022**. Applicants of all genders between the ages of 17-39 who are considered musically qualified for the live audition will be contacted by The USAF Band auditions team and will receive an audition invitation letter. All invited candidates must be prepared to meet Air Force maximum allowable weight standards available at www.airforce.com. Live audition rounds will be held on **May 2**nd – **4**th at Joint Base Anacostia-Bolling, Washington, DC.

PRE-SCREENING REQUIREMENTS INCLUDE:

- One page resume <u>labeled last name</u>, <u>first name</u> and resume content must include street address, <u>phone</u> number, and email address. Must be received as a PDF or word doc (no cloud storage/file sharing links).
- Audio recordings of the following:
 - 1. **Star Spangled Banner** Solo rendition in key of choice
 - 2. **Twisted** Solo rendition. See attached lead sheet (transpose as necessary). Record with a metronome on 2 and 4 at 160bpm (80bpm). Form: AABCD end on the C6 chord where it says "break" before the D.S.
 - 3. Popular Music Selection

Jazz Standard or similar original composition in the following styles:

- 4. Swing
- 5. Bossa Nova or Samba
- 6. Ballad

*Be sure to submit selections that highlight your strengths. With the exception of *Twisted* and *Star Spangled Banner*, selections should be submitted with accompaniment and can come from a studio or live performance.

Jazz Vocalist Qualifications: Vocalist must be a professional and versatile vocalist with the capability of performing all jazz styles in big band and small group settings. Vocalist must demonstrate technical mastery of their voice as well as a deep understanding of creative phrasing, dynamics, and improvisation. Vocalist must be a competent sight-reader with the ability to master, retain, and execute new music quickly and accurately. Vocalist must be comfortable performing the duties associated with fronting the Airmen of Note, including: speaking in front of large audiences, having an engaging and professional stage presence, interacting with community and military leaders, and effectively communicating Air Force messaging. Vocalist must be able to effortlessly sing the US National Anthem at high visibility events.
