In 1943 he transferred from Special Services to the Army Air Force where he came to the attention of General Henry Harley Arnold. Commanding general of the U.S. Army Air Forces during World War II, "Hap" Arnold was ahead of his time, seeking subtle ways in which to wage "influence"



instead of war. He commissioned musicians, actors and artists such as Glenn Miller and Ogden Pleissner to help raise the morale of the troops at home, on the front and behind enemy lines where new music and even jazz were prohibited by the Third Reich. **Read more »**
